Old Business

SHCCC Banquet Event Banquet (3/21/2026). Received Loew's Gift card for \$250. Options for use of the gift card included flowers for the neighborhood's front entrance and solar lights for all entrances. Mr. Davenport will look into getting solar lights. The card can be provided to Mr. Pointer for the expense for the flowers. S. Leonard has the gift card.

Cambridge Park Work- Status. Mr. Miles did speak with the project manager regarding the preferred route on transport trucks in /out of neighborhood. Traffic seems less.

Civic Club Officers 2026. There are no changes in the Civic Club Officers.

Bylaws Review- tenure of Officers was the only revision. S. Leonard to update the Bylaws. Pending.

Civic Club Dues/Fund raisers 2026. The 4/17 meeting to discuss the fish fry was cancelled.

The Fish Fry will not be held this year due to the short time frame to prepare and lack of needed participants. Other fund-raising options were discussed to include neighborhood walks to collect dues (get T-shirts to wear during the walk), try door hangers again, and phone calls to neighbors (maybe even volunteering to call/contact your neighbors) to encourage them to pay dues.

Deed Restrictions-SHCCC asked the Civic Club to submit our deeds and any suggested changes. S. Leonard agreed to get clear copies of the deeds from the Courthouse. We will review and recommend changes if any are identified.

The Civic Club will not be changing banks at this time. Ms. Spates has previously researched the pros/cons of doing this. No benefit identified.



New Business

Per S. Leonard, Ms. Spates provided information that both the tax-exempt return and franchise tax return have been filed for our KP-RP Civic Club. There is no fee for our franchise tax (income below limit) but the tax-exempt return fee was \$54.99. This fee is reflected in the March 2026 Treasury report.

Super neighborhood Reactivation

Ms. Scurlock reported that the Superneighborhood met on 3/24 and is now re-activated. A Board was selected. Ms. Amber Wright was elected as President. Ms. Scurlock was elected as Vice President. Some of the business addressed included new bylaws (pending approval) by City Council. The re-activation will allow the member HOA's and Civic Clubs be eligible for specified benefits (e.g. certain grants). Ms. Scurlock will follow up to get information on meeting dates, time & locations.

Issues from the Floor/Announcements/ Other:

Mr. Ray reported a concern for vehicles parked illegally along Trail Lake Street prohibiting easy passage. It was suggested that the non-emergency police are notified.

Guest: Judge Sharon Burney, Pct 7, Place 2 was present near the end of our meeting. She provided information asking to be re-elected in the Democrat Primary. Election Day: May 26, 2026.

It was announced that Mr. Elgin Taylor (longtime resident and active Civic Club member) passed.
